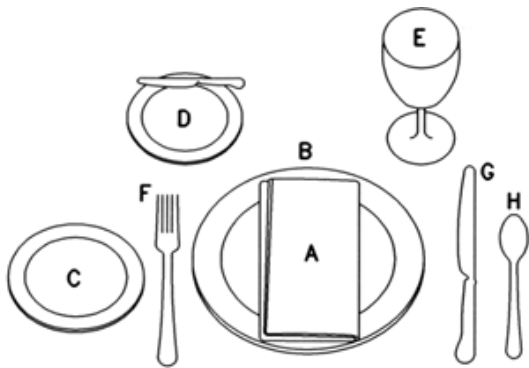


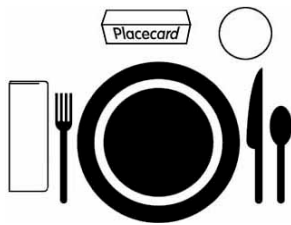
Place Setting Examples

In 4-H Foods Lab Project competitions, the final version of the food should be displayed on a serving platter, tray, dish, casserole, bowl, basket or other suitable serving container. Participants should also display one place setting of table service which would be use in serving the meal. The table setting should include the appropriate plate, flatware (spoon, fork, etc.), napkin, glass or cup, tablecloth, placemat, Plastic or paper plates, cups, and cutlery may also be used if appropriate for the food prepared. A centerpiece may be included if the participant wishes, but is not required. 4-H'ers may also display their menu and recipe on the table

Fork to the left of plate, tines (points) up; Nicely folded napkin next to fork; Knife to the right of plate, sharp edge pointed toward plate; Spoon to the right of knife; Cup or glass above knife & spoon; Centerpiece or Placecard (if used) above plate.
